Regulation and the Loan Market

Public policy, regulation and litigation impact the syndicated loan market in many ways. LIBOR transition has profoundly changed the structure and pricing of loans in recent years. Rulemakings can reconfigure major lenders such as CLOs. And litigation—such as Kirschner—can redefine what, exactly, is a syndicated loan. This session will dive into how exogenous impacts such as these change the fabric of the loan market.

The How and Why of ESG in Credit and PE

ESG — often talked about, but rarely explained. This session will give an overview of how ESG is integrated into credit analysis and the impact that ESG considerations have on investment decisions. Unlike impact investing, ESG in credit markets has largely been focused on financially material ESG information which allows for a more robust risk profile. ESG integration in private equity investments also focuses on financially material information, but may look to opportunities as well as risks. This trend has been led by investors but increasingly has regulatory implications. ESG information on companies is therefore critical. Where the availability of ESG information on private companies has faced challenges, industry collaboration resulting in the ESG Integrated Disclosure Project (IDP) and ESG Data Convergence Initiative (EDCI) offers a way forward.
